In the last 15 months since Janice and I started running her father's mission in Africa some amazing things have happened! Our clinic treated over 9,400 patients in 2010. We added a second grade to our three preschool classes and first grade and are now educating 147 children. We received an enhanced water treatment and distribution system and we now provide from 6,000 to 8,000 liters to the community every day. Our widows and orphans programs are providing critical assistance to people. And much more.

It will be a very busy summer! Thanks to Mount Bethel United Methodist Church and Project 82 we're going to create a laboratory to support our small clinic. We are going to build better facilities for our orphans and staff families this summer, along with an expanded water system.

We're looking for partners to help us with a myriad of much needed projects. We have put forth proposals to build an Eco Cultural Vocational Training Center to train people for Kenya's robust tourism industry, and a health center. We would like to build proper classrooms for our students, and an orphan center for the ever-growing number of orphans in the sector.

Due to the generous contributions in time and resources from our friends we're making great progress in Segera! Thank you for all your support. For those of you who haven't visited us, please come, get involved, and give your money and your talents to a community in a remote part of Kenya! Thanks so much!
